## Associate Judge of the Rhode Island District Court

The deadline for filing applications with the Commission is 5:00 p.m. on Monday, October 31, 2022. No applications received after the deadline will be considered. Please note that once a candidate has submitted all required application materials, they <u>must notify the Commission Legal Assistant by email</u> (<u>laura.verdecchia@lockelord.com</u>). A candidate's application will not be considered complete until the Commission Legal Assistant has received the confirmation email from the candidate.

NOTE: If you previously submitted an application for the Associate Judge of the Rhode Island District Court vacancy created by the passage of a law authorizing an additional judicial position on the District Court, posted by the Commission on August 15, 2022, and/or for the Associate Judge of the Rhode Island District Court vacancy created by the retirement of Elaine T. Bucci, posted by the Commission on September 1, 2022, your application(s) will automatically be considered for this Associate Judge of the Rhode Island District Court vacancy, created by the retirement of Judge Christine Jabour, effective November 1, 2022. If you did not apply for either of the prior District Court vacancies posted on August 15 and September 1, 2022, your application will only be consider for this vacancy.
